Honoring Mo'i Kane Kamehameha 'Ekahi

It has long been the tradition of our club to not have a General Membership Meeting because it is usually the same time as Float Construction week for the Kamehameha Day Parade. There are numerous activities surrounding and leading up to June 11th, the birthday of Kamehameha the Great.

The Societies are busy preparing for events that require protocol, pomp and circumstance. There is lei making, lei draping, torch lighting ceremonies and processions at the Kamehameha Statues taking place. Food is being prepared for luaus. Horse riding units are finishing outfits and making their leis. Marching bands are preparing their uniforms and musical selections. Floats are under constructions with flowers and fauna being picked, shipped in, and brought to staging areas.

It is the 40th Anniversary of the Kamehameha Day Parade. It is also the last year that the usual team of Uncles **David Ka'aha'aina, Richard Jackson and Leibert O'Sullivan** would chair and head the construction, decoration and demolition of the Mo'i Float. The Float is a fundraising project for the Prince Kuhio Hawaiian Civic Club Operational Fund. It is a time of work, yet fun, exciting and builds great comraderie.

This year there was no shortage of work. It was hard, not nearly as fun and with a membership of over 200, the turnout was disappointing at best. We had solicited from our membership help in order to build a new team that could work with our Uncles then take the lead as they did some 15 years ago. We managed to succeed to some degree when Ron Larsen and Hanalei Ramirez stepped in to assist. Uncle David was there for 2 ½ days running, as was Uncle Leibert. Uncle Leibert worked side-by-side with Uncle David when not doing a pick-up or running errands. Uncle Richard worked until he had to prepare and cook dinner for the volunteers.

Mahalo to Ron Larsen and Kainoa Jarrett for helping to build the float. Mahalo to Miki Bowers who showed up with 15 beautiful stalks of red haliconia used to line the back of the float and Ray Chung who worked all Friday and into the night. Kudos to Hanalei Ramirez who worked straight through until the gate was locked. He got a team of women to make over three dozen ti-leaf puolo and another team to decorate the back of the float. He and Keola Jarrett did a fantastic job on the large tropical arrangement at the front of the float. It has become a trademark that beautifully offsets the Mo'i and his entourage of warriors. It was striking.

‘Aha Hipu’u - First Society and Order Convention

July 21-23 will be history in the making as the four Royal Societies will gather for the first time to discuss and share their Kuleana of preserving the protocols of our Ali’i.

Lot Kapuaiwa, His Majesty King Kamehameha V founded the ***Royal Order of Kamehameha I*** in 1865 to defend the sovereignty of the Kingdom of Hawaii. After the overthrow of Her Majesty Queen Lili’uokalani, the Provisional government declared the Royal Order of Kamehameha I a threat. The Order went underground until 1903 when His Royal Highness Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana’ole lead a torchlight ceremony around the statue of Kamehameha I declared in public the restoration of the Royal Order of Kamehameha I, announced the reorganization of the Hawaiian Royal Societies, and created the Hawaiian Civic Clubs. Today, the organization continues to guard, maintain, and preserve the rituals and the memory of the ruling Chiefs of Hawaii. *Na Wahine Hui O Kamehameha* is the female counterpart to the men of the Royal Order. The ***Ahahui Ka’ahumanu or Ka’ahumanu Society*** was formed in 1864 and reorganized in 1905. Its purpose is celebrating the life of Queen Ka’ahumanu and preserving the pomp and circumstances of the monarchy. 2005 marked its 100th Centennial Anniversary. ***‘Ahahui Mamakakaua – Daughters and Sons of Hawaiian Warriors*** is the fourth Society. The ‘Aha Hipu’u will be held at the Ala Moana Hotel and members can contact the Royal Order of Kamehameha for information
